## Reflections on Participating in the SGA Elections

Every year, the Student Government Association (SGA) holds two elections: a mock-election for the governor of NJ - and a school-wide election to select the school's SGA officers. This year, as a candidate for the office of President for the Culinary Arts Hospitality and Tourism School (CAHTS) at Eastside, I experienced firsthand the intensity of the electoral process.



The SGA consists of a President, Vice President, and Secretary. In order to become part of the SGA, a candidate must simply get more votes than their opponents. These votes come from the candidates' peers within their school, and each candidate has the opportunity to campaign.

On Election Day, each candidate can set up a voting booth where students meet their SGA candidates and vote. Teachers then escort their classes to the booths where each candidate introduces themselves and hopefully secure votes.

Participation as a candidate helped me to develop better social skills, and to work more effectively under pressure. For example, my booth became chaotic at certain times and since so many people were talking at once, it forced me to deal appropriately with all the activity.
